Manchester: a great university city

As the world's first industrialised city, Manchester has its roots firmly in innovation and business. Its undeniable buzz, unique cosmopolitan character and varied ethnic mix gives the city its unofficial title of the most popular student city in the UK.

Spectacular

A city of culture, music and sport, you'll always find something to do. World-class museums, international cinemas, theatres, opera, ballet and comedy clubs all feature, showcasing regional, national and international talent. There are music venues aplenty, from the small and intimate to the 21,000 seater Manchester Evening News Arena, alongside hundreds of pubs, bars and nightclubs. The shopping is spectacular too, from large malls with all the high street names you would expect, to independent and quirky shops selling one-offs and vintage treasures.

Multicultural

Manchester is a truly multicultural city, with long established Asian, Caribbean, Chinese, Jewish and Polish communities, leaving you well-placed to immerse yourself in events such as the Mela, Caribbean carnivals, literary, music and international festivals. Cafés and restaurants are plentiful and suit all budgets and tastes, with food from around the globe, including the famous Chinatown in the city centre and the Curry Mile in Rusholme.

Sporting

The city's sporting reputation is world-famous, with its two football clubs, rugby clubs, Lancashire Cricket Club, National Squash Centre, Sportcity, National Cycling Centre, Aquatics Centre and BelleVue Hockey centre.

Multinational businesses

The University is well-placed to take advantage of its location in the thriving North West, Europe's 12th largest regional economy at £120billion. Home to well over a quarter of a million businesses, it's the second largest media hub in the country, and the largest financial and professional services centre outside London.

As the fastest-growing city outside London, Manchester is home to many headquarters of multinational businesses including The Co-operative Group, Cussons, Brother, Kelloggs, Adidas and Siemens, providing employment opportunities in a variety of sectors. In addition, the BBC has recently relocated several of its departments to Media City, further strengthening Manchester's reputation as a hotbed of creative talent.

Hollings Faculty: At the heart of the action in All Saints

The new Hollings Faculty is in the middle of All Saints Campus, adjacent to our Manchester Art School and overlooking All Saints Park, popular with students as the outdoor place to meet and relax with friends.



The students and staff of Hollings will be at the heart of the action in Oxford Road, Manchester; it is home to one of the largest university student populations in Europe with nearly 80,000 students located here.

The All Saints campus is already home to the Faculty of Business and Law, Faculty of Humanities, Languages and Social Science, Manchester School of Art and the Faculty of Science and Engineering.

It is a busy, exciting and social campus for the exchange of creative ideas and knowledge amongst like-minded students.

The campus has excellent transport links to the city's stations, metro stops and bus connections. It's just a five minute walk to Oxford Road Station and a 15 minute walk to Piccadilly.

Student Hub

Specialist facilities for Hospitality Students

Hospitality students will have new, state-of-the-art equipment with professional kitchen, functioning bar and seminar room on the fifth floor at the Fielden Campus in nearby Didsbury, just a short bus ride from the All Saints campus.

Additional facilities for Food and Nutrition Students

The practical elements of the microbiology, chemistry and biochemistry units within the nutrition and food courses will be taught in the excellent laboratories at John Dalton. Using classical analytical techniques such as titration, colorimetric tests and nitrogen determination plus new technologies such as PCR, students will be able to carry out thorough nutritional, microbial and biochemical analyses of food and drinks to test the very latest theories in food and nutritional science.

Placement and Employability Zone

Hollings Placement and Employability Zone is located at the entrance to the Righton building. The Placement and Employability team offer a comprehensive service to all Hollings students seeking placements and other work opportunities, and support and guidance on all aspects of placements and employability such as CV preparation, recruitment and selection techniques and working overseas.

Postgraduate study suite

The Hollings Faculty has a thriving and active research community that coordinates, supports and promotes research, innovation and enterprise.

As part of the multi-million pound refurbishment of the Hollings Faculty, dedicated spaces has been developed on the second floor of Cavendish Building for postgraduate students on taught programmes and active researchers.

Postgraduate Research Students

Our research students (who include MSc, MA, MPhil and PhD) will formally join the existing Manchester Institute for Research and Innovation in Art and Design (MIRIAD) research centre, located on the second floor of Righton Building.

Access and Security



Main entrance

- The main access into both the Righton and Cavendish Buildings is via the Righton doors which are situated on Lower Chatham Street.

Swipe card access

- A swipe card system has been installed to provide controlled access to certain areas of the building.
- The University requires all members of its community, whether students or staff to **carry their MMU ID card at all times on University premises and to present their card for checking upon reasonable request by a member of the University or Student Union security staff.**
- Your existing MMU student card will enable you to access the relevant offices and teaching rooms. **Your classes may be timetabled in other buildings across the All Saints Campus and you will need your swipe card to access these areas.**
- The access control system will disengage in the event of fire alarm activation and is remotely monitored by the University's security staff from the Security Control Room.

Disabled Access

- The floors are level and there is a passenger lift to the upper floors of the Cavendish Building.

Your classes may be timetabled in other buildings across the All Saints Campus and you will need your swipe card to access these areas.

Security

- In addition to the traditional key lock system, the front doors of the Righton Building are also fitted with a sophisticated, centrally controlled electronic access system, providing a high level of security.
- The building requires swipe card access so please remember to carry your student ID card with you at all times.
- Keep expensive university equipment and your own valuables out of sight and securely locked away.

- The main reception desk is on the ground floor of the Righton building and will be open at the times above. Reception contact number is 0161 247 2600.

Reporting a fire

If you discover a fire or suspect the presence of a fire:

- Sound the fire alarm by operating the nearest break glass point.
- Summon the Fire Brigade by dialling 999 (or 9-999 from a university telephone).
- Call 2222 (on a university telephone) and give details of the fire to MMU Security.
- Only attack the fire with the nearest suitable equipment if you have been trained to do so.
- Leave the building by the nearest available exit, closing all doors behind you.
- Proceed to your assembly point at the corner of All Saints Park adjacent to the public telephone boxes.
- Do not re-enter the building until officially informed that it is safe to do so.

If you hear the continuous fire alarm:

- Leave the building by the nearest exit available, closing all doors behind you.
- Proceed to your assembly point.
- Do not re-enter the building until officially informed that it is safe to do so.

Assembly point

- All Saints Park adjacent to the public telephone boxes.

Fire disabled refuge

- Refuge areas are provided on the landings on the main staircase in the Cavendish building.
- In the event of an emergency a fire marshal or coordinator will proceed to refuge area to assist the disabled person to be evacuated from the building.

Fire alarm testing

- The alarm system will be tested every week: this will be of a short duration, and evacuation is not required unless the alarm is continuous.
- An automatic fire alarm installation has been installed to provide coverage throughout the building by the use of smoke and heat detectors and final exit manual call points.
- The fire alarm panel is located at reception in the foyer area at the entrance to the building. In order to interpret the fire alarm signal, a zone chart is provided next to the fire alarm panel. A secondary alarm panel is situated at Cavendish reception.

The fire alarm panel provides visual indication to the fire brigade in the event of fire.

IT Zones



Library Services

The Sir Kenneth Green Library is located at the heart of the All Saints campus and provides you with a full range of services and resources to help you complete your studies and research successfully.

As well as the wealth of electronic resources available to you both on and off campus, you now have easy access to an increased range of print resources e.g. Fashion and Textile students can take advantage of the combined Art and Design subject resources.

You will also benefit from 24/7 opening during the whole of the academic year. This means you will be able to access the library resources in the evenings and on weekends.

The Sir Kenneth Green Library has been undergoing major refurbishment in order to provide a more welcoming environment and further enhance your learning spaces. Phase 2 of the refurbishment is now underway and includes:

- Creation of a new IT Zone on the first floor
- Creation of a Quiet Study Zone on the fourth floor
- Improvements to the infrastructure, including the heating/ventilation system, lighting and replacement of windows.

In September, library staff will be available to welcome new and returning students to the library. During this time, new students will receive an induction to the wealth of library services available to them, while returning students will also have the opportunity to meet library staff and explore the library and its facilities.

Term time opening hours

The main library is open **24/7 during term time** starting Monday 23rd September. A night team in the Library will ensure the safety of the building and its occupants. The "Late Shift" will only be able to log any queries or problems that may arise but they will pass these on to library staff when they come in.

PCs, printing and photocopying facilities will be available. You can continue to study and to consult library stock.


The Hub Café at the Business School serves a selection of premium sandwiches, snacks, muffins and cakes. A range of chilled soft drinks and barista coffees are available – open until 8.00pm Monday –Thursday and also opens on Saturday and Sunday.

Getting to All Saints

The All Saints Campus has excellent transport links to the city's stations, metro stops and bus connections.

By train

Manchester Oxford Road Railway Station

The All Saints campus is just a five minute walk away. Turn right out of Oxford Road Station and walk underneath the railway bridge. The All Saints campus is to your right.

Manchester Piccadilly Railway Station

Follow the signs for Fairfield Street taxi ranks and take the 147 bus to Oxford Road/All Saints. The bus runs every 10-15 minutes. You can also walk, which takes 10-15 minutes.

Manchester Victoria Railway Station

Follow the signs for the free metro shuttle bus service 2 (green). Get off at Chester Street and walk up to Oxford Road and turn right. The metro shuttle service runs every 10 minutes.

By bus

Fallowfield to All Saints

Take any of the following buses from Wilmslow Road and get off at Oxford Road/All Saints: 42, 42A, 43, 44, 111, 142 or 143.

Piccadilly Gardens Bus Station

Take any of the following buses from Piccadilly Gardens and get off at Oxford Road/All Saints: 15, 16, 41, 42, 42A, 43, 44, 46, 47, 48, 111, 142, 143, 250 and 263. You can also walk, which takes 10-20 minutes.

By Metrolink

St Peters Square Metrolink Stop

You can walk, which takes 10 minutes. Walk down Oxford Street/Oxford Road, in the opposite direction to the Midland Hotel, past the Palace Theatre and Oxford Road Railway Station. The All Saints campus is on your right.
