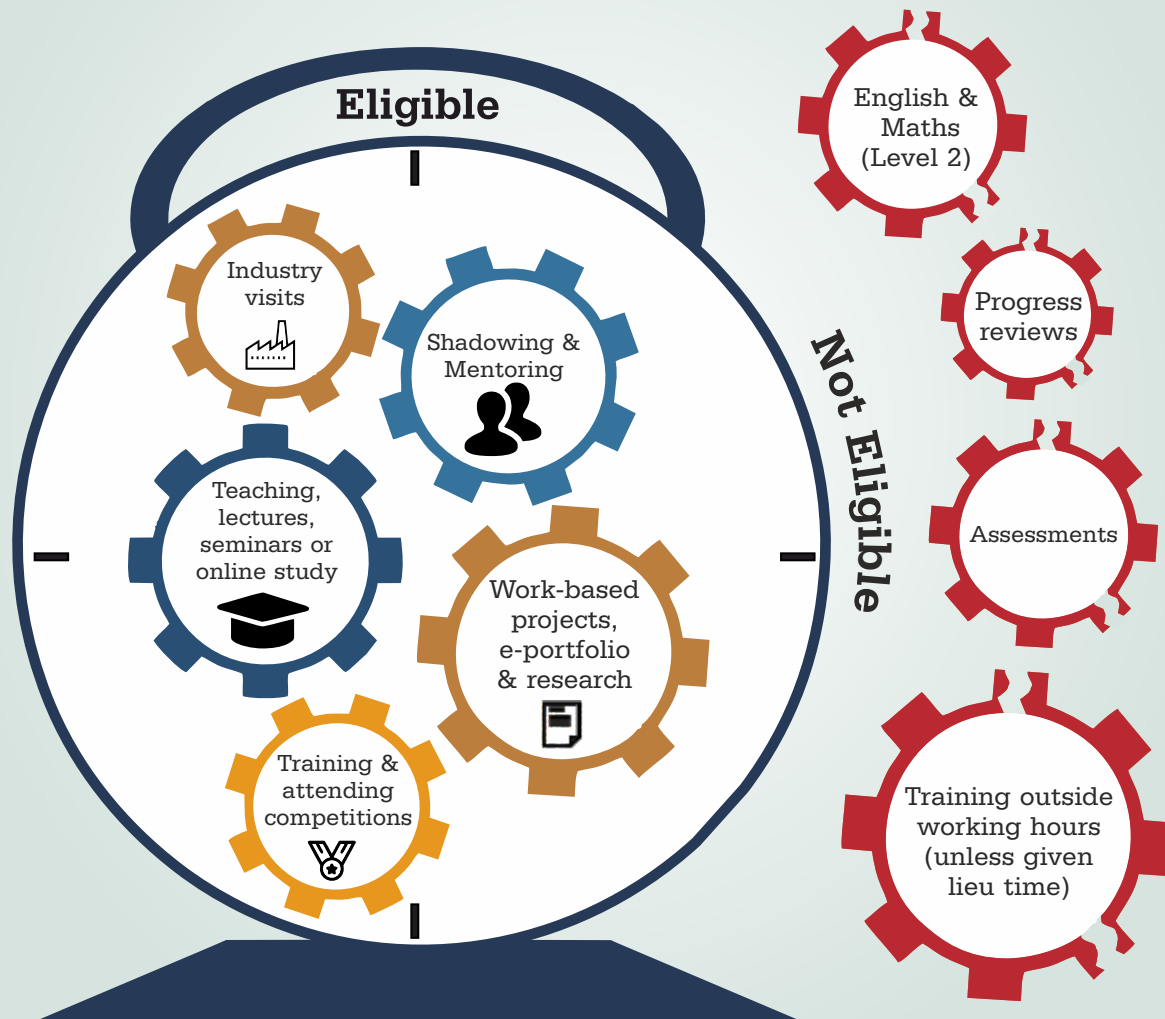


APPRENTICESHIPS OFF-THE-JOB TRAINING
