Multi-cultural Manchester

We launch our 2014 MCBF schools programme with two days of activity celebrating multi-cultural Manchester. With exhibitions and taster sessions exploring music, poetry and languages, pupils of all ages can have a thoroughly enjoyable day, while learning much about the many languages and cultures that make up Manchester in 2014.

An exhibition featuring work from two major projects – *Walking in their Shoes: Migrating Passions* and the *Mother Tongue, Other Tongue* national Laureate Education project – will be the focus of interactive workshops, and each half-day package will include 2×45 -minute taster sessions from a menu of music, language, poetry and food-themed workshops.

From 12.30 – 1.00pm on the Thursday (a slot which bridges the morning and afternoon sessions, and is open to attendees of both), there will be performances by multi-national groups working with One-Education Music and the ManMetMunch team will be on hand with mul-tea cultural tastings of drinks and other tasty treats from around the world. Spaces will be made available for groups wishing to consume packed lunches between sessions. Our Atrium Café will also be open throughout the day. Schools wishing to make a full day of it on the Thursday can opt to book for the Sufiya Ahmed author event – or simply book two half-day packages per pupil.

What it's really like to be a Beanstalk reading helper By author (and Manchester Children's Book Festival's very own) Sherry Ashworth

'I've always been just a bit excited about books. Since I was a child I've loved going in to libraries or bookshops, and picking something new to read – it was that sense of a story waiting to unfold, an adventure waiting to happen. I got that same excitement when I arrived at Beanstalk HQ for my training as a Beanstalk reading helper. Look at all those books on the shelves! I had to drag my eyes away from the titles to listen carefully and join in some of activities designed to show us how to help struggling young readers. It was all about encouragement, empathy and enthusiasm.



Cleverly designed exercises put us in the place of young readers, and the trainers answered all our many questions. I was lucky to get my first placement fairly quickly, and am loving the three hours a week I spend with my three primary school pupils. Beanstalk reading helpers don't tell the children which books to read, but we let them choose. As a result I have learned a great deal about football, bikes and even chess. My best moment? When one of the boys picked up a Jacqueline Wilson title and said, 'Shall we read that?'



Our extensive schools outreach programme, delivered under the banner of *Walking in Their Shoes* and managed by the schools outreach team in the Faculty of Humanities, Languages and Social Science at Manchester Metropolitan University, makes sure that we do exactly that.

Supported by University funding, with additional income from ticket sales and commercial sponsorship, we are able to ensure that it is not just children and young people whose parents and teachers can afford to bring them to events who benefit. When major authors come to Manchester for a ticketed event, we also try to send them into schools and libraries.

We offer our partner schools:

- priority booking with free and subsidised tickets for events from the core MCBF programme;
- the opportunity to host author visits and events during the Festival;
- MCBF trailblazers, like the Anne Frank Exhibition (coming to MMU in March 2014) and a year-long programme of other activities and workshops in schools;
- extended projects with online resources.
 For 2014, these include: Tweets from the Trenches, Comic Smart, Mother Tongue, Other Tongue and Migrating Passions.

Though the Manchester Children's Book Festival takes place for just 11 days once every two years, our schools outreach work continues with a rolling programme of activities offered by MMU and our MCBF partner organisations. In order to share this work we have set up the Manchester Creative Learning Network, Network membership includes thousands of active teacher contacts and we send out a monthly email newsletter with information about creative learning opportunities.



Booking Tickets

Details of how to book tickets for individual events are given under each listing in the main programme (pages 2 to 32). Tickets for most main events can be booked through the Quay Tickets box office by calling **0843 208 0500** or online via our website: **www.mcbf.org.uk**. You can select whether to receive printed tickets through the post or electronic tickets via email.

All tickets booked through Quay Tickets box office are subject to a booking fee, which is already included in the ticket price quoted next to each event listing. You can choose at check-out whether to receive your tickets by email to print at home (for a cost of 75p per transaction) or to have printed tickets sent out to you for an additional £1.25 postage fee. Neither email nor print tickets be issued for free events where booking is required; instead, your name will be added to a guest list for the event and you'll be asked to check-in to the venue on arrival.

Concessionary rates (unless otherwise specified) are available to anyone aged 16 or under, pensioners, students in possession of a valid college or university ID card, current members of Manchester Metropolitan University staff and MMU Alumni.

Where possible, a selection of books by participating authors will be available to purchase at relevant events, and many of the authors will be happy to sign copies afterwards.

Access

The Manchester Children's Book Festival welcomes disabled visitors and we aim to make our events accessible to the broadest possible audience. Many of our venues are equipped with hearing aid induction loops, are wheelchair-friendly, have 'speaking lifts' with controls at wheelchair level and in Braille, and disabled toilets. Wheelchair users will be able to indicate when booking tickets for most events that they will be attending in a wheelchair. Carers attending with disabled guests are entitled top book tickets at the concessionary rate where applicable - but will need a ticket to attend. Age Restrictions

Children aged under 16 attending any aspect of the Manchester Children's Book Festival must be accompanied by an adult at all times. Babies in arms aged two years and under are permitted to attend for free provided that they remain on an adults knee through the performance.
